Improvement in Bed Transferring (#0175) measures whether the patient's ability to get in and out of bed at end of care (EOC) improves relative to the patient's ability to get in and out of bed at start or resumption of care (SOC/ROC). To improve, patients will receive support from three primary sources: the home health agency that provides skilled care, caregivers, and themselves. For Improvement in Bed Transferring (#0175) we are concerned with attributing the improvement to the home health agency care, and as a result, we risk-adjust the observed improvement to account for differences in patient characteristics at SOC/ROC (see Figure 1 for a visual depiction of the logic model).
