2.1 Logic Model: Provider (Skilled Nursing Facilities, Inpatient Rehabilitation Facilities, Long-Term Care Hospitals) Structures and Processes Associated with Patients' Functional Outcomes

Provider Structures:

- Qualified and experienced clinicians and administrators
 - Board-certified rehabilitation physicians
 - Physician consultants
 - Occupational therapists, physical therapists, speechlanguage pathologists
 - Certified RNs
 - Care managers, discharge planners
 - Psychologists, social workers, chaplains, wheelchair seating experts, orthotists, prosthetists
- Availability of equipment/devices that allow patients to practice activities
- Accreditation and/or specialty certification
- Information systems that facilitate communication and documentation
- Access to clinical trials and other research

Processes (Interventions, Services):

- Comprehensive clinical assessments of each patient to determine medical issues and functional limitations
- Patient (family) and clinical team co-created treatment plan with goals
 - Type, amount, and intensity of therapy (occupational therapy, physical therapy, speechlanguage pathologist) dose (rehabilitation intensity or minutes of therapy)
 - Daily physician visits
 - Nursing staff, including rehabilitation nurses
 - Psychological and psychiatric services
 - Respiratory therapy services
 - Patient/family engagement and education
 - Peer mentor visits
 - Interdisciplinary rounds/treatment conference
 - Implementation of effective safety protocols (prevent falls, infections, pressure ulcers/injuries)
 - Recreational therapy, music therapy, dog therapy
